# Expectant Watchfulness Psalm 130

- •There are over 150 Psalms that are broken down into 5 separate books
  - •Book 1(1-41)
  - •Book 2(42-72)
  - •Book 3(73-89)
  - •Book 4(90-106)
  - •Book 5(107-150)

- •Psalm 130 is part of what is called the 'penitential' psalms or psalms of confession, where they express sorrow for sin
- •It is also the 11<sup>th</sup> of 15 'Songs of Accents' (120 134)

- •The Songs of Accents are broken into 4 categories:
  - Laments (120, 123, 126, 130)
  - Thanksgiving(121, 122, 131)
  - Community hymns (124, 125, 129, 134)
  - Wisdom (127, 128, 133)
  - Royal Song about God in Zion (132)

- •Four of these Psalms are attributed to David (122, 124, 131, 133) and one to Solomon (127), while the other 10 are anonymous
- •It is possible they were written during the Babylonian captivity

·By tradition, it was thought to have been read or sang by Israelite pilgrims on their way to Jerusalem to celebrate various annual rituals like Passover, Feast of Weeks, Feast of Tents or Tabernacles


<sup>6</sup> My soul waits for the Lord More than those who watch for the morning—Yes, more than those who watch for the morning.


### Commentary: Sin Levels

- •Sin any thought or action that goes against God, whether by commission or omission, whether intentional or unintentional
  - E.g. unknowingly getting drunk



### Commentary: Sin Levels

- •Transgression –
  intentional sin, knowing
  it's wrong, but doing it
  anyway regardless of the
  consequences
  - E.g. knowingly getting drunk



### Commentary: Sin Levels

•Iniquity -

transgression that has become lifestyle to such a degree you do not know anything else or can no longer have self-control

• E.g. Alcoholism



### Commentary: God is Able

### Commentary: Waiting on the Lord

- •We mistakenly think of waiting as a passive exercise or doing nothing
- •Waiting on the Lord starts with TRUST and CONFIDENCE. This dispels fear and despair.
- •We also wait on the Lord through SEEKING Him, through worship and His Word
